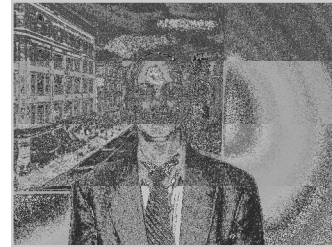


The REDC Review –

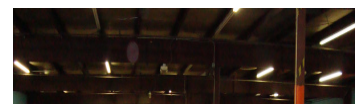
